Lattwanda speaks warmly about the changes in her daughter, Amerianna, after her experience last summer with the Urban Ecology Center's Summer Camp.

Amerianna, like most children these days, has been attending school virtually since Spring 2020. During an unconventional year and a summer filled with quarantining and social distancing; "It was really beneficial for her to be able to come last year and be outside, because kids need to be outside, they need that peer interaction."

Her mother is extremely thankful for all of the friends her daughter has been able to make at camp, especially given that Amerianna "was an only child for a very long time, so that helped her be able to get out and interact with other kids."

Lattwanda laughs recalling Amerianna asking to be signed up for various UEC programs, "She went to every last camp I could get her in!" From Discovery Quest and Eco Art to Little Minnows and Outdoor Detectives, Amerianna learned all about the outdoors and how important it is to everyone - no matter where you live.

Summer Camp not only helped Amerianna socially, but academically, too. Lattwanda marvels at the way camp has helped her. "When it comes to school, she gets all A's when it comes to nature and botany."

Outside of the classroom, Lattwanda is still pleasantly surprised. "Even now, we can be somewhere and she'll see a particular plant and she'll tell me a little bit about the plant. I can't even remember half of the stuff she's told me because it's been so much! She learns so much when she's able to come to the Urban Ecology Center."


