# Accomplishments & Highlights



We were hard at work in the 2011-2012 fiscal year, connecting people with the outdoors in an effort to help them live healthy, abundant lifestyles. With the support of our community, we are poised to make even greater impacts in Milwaukee and beyond. Our collective accomplishments are the result of cooperative efforts across all aspects of the Center.

# **Agency Wide**

The Urban Ecology Center is a place where people can learn about and enjoy nature...even in the city. We get people of all ages outside and active every single day! This year we engaged more schools, volunteers, visitors and participants than before, broke ground and finished construction on our Menomonee Valley branch, and continued to field calls from all over the world related to this unique Milwaukee idea: the Urban Ecology Center.

In the 2011-2012 fiscal year, we continued to build relationships and raise our profile with key organizations, including the University of Wisconsin-Milwaukee's leadership team and former U.S. Department of the Interior Secretary Ken Salazar. Peter Senge, internationally known organizational strategist, continued to help us foster relationships with the Society for Organizational Partnership (SoL Ed) and the Academy for Systemic Change, a global learning community composed of innovative leaders in business, education and science.

We were honored to break ground with Hank Aaron on the 24-acre park located along the Menomonee River between 27th and 37th Streets. The park will become our outdoor classroom for hands-on, experiential environmental education programs in the Menomonee Valley.

Finally, we invested in the staff and infrastructure needed to effectively operate and fund our growing organization. We launched a new website complete with online program registration and developed our strategic plan to achieve our vision for the future. All of these assets improve our organizational sustainability and efficiency.

### **Volunteer Engagement**

Year after year, we are humbled by the support of the individuals and groups that come together to volunteer with the Urban Ecology Center. Whether they are pulling garlic mustard, helping to introduce urban youth to the Milwaukee River for the first time, or greeting visitors at the front desk, volunteers are continually having a positive impact on our community. This year has been no different.

This past year, volunteers committed nearly 130 hours to a two-week "Plant-a-Thon" that resulted in the planting of over 2,000 new trees, shrubs, grasses, and wildflowers for the Milwaukee Rotary Centennial Arboretum project. They helped in the design and the creation of Washington Park's new and improved animal room and helped create a wall-sized mosaic for the Menomonee Valley branch. Our volunteers continue to be a source of irreplaceable support for the Urban Ecology Center as program assistants, receptionists, land stewards, researchers, and much, much more.

Across all three branches, we had a total of over 2,000 individuals volunteer, visiting our Centers over 5,500 times. This resulted in a contribution of over 17,000 volunteer hours. We cannot thank our volunteers enough for their tremendous investment of time and talent to support this important work!

# **Branch Update**

# **Menomonee Valley**

This year in the Menomonee Valley was focused on getting the branch ready to open its doors in September of 2012.

## **Breaking Ground**

We broke ground on the building on September 7th, 2011 and through the excellent work of teams from Uihlein/Wilson Architects, Berghammer Construction, and many companies right in the Menomonee Valley, our plans came to life. The dilapidated former tavern became a home for our newest environmental community center, complete with flexible learning and gathering spaces, reused materials that speak to the history of the Valley, ecologically-minded features such as a geothermal heating and cooling system, and (of course) a slide!

## **Growing Our Staff**

With the building ready, we needed a great staff to welcome our neighbors into the new Center. We conducted national searches for eight people who would become the Menomonee Valley team and we pulled together an incredibly dynamic and balanced group of people. Over 70% of the program staff is bilingual in English and Spanish and, in our new community where a large portion of the population is Spanish-speaking, this will allow us to deliver quality programming to all of our neighbors.

## **Community Connections**

Even before the Center opened to the public, our staff was hard at work making community connections. We recruited schools for our schoolbased education program, Neighborhood Environmental Education Project (NEEP), strengthened our partnerships with community organizations such as the Layton Boulevard West Neighbors, and engaged a local artist to lead community members in creating a mosaic that would bring the spirit of the river and its neighbors to our building's living room.

## **Building Relationships**

Our work in the Menomonee Valley extends far beyond the Center itself. It is one piece of our collaborative "From the Ground Up" effort with the Menomonee Valley Partners to increase community assets in the Menomonee Valley. This year, we hit another major milestone with the groundbreaking of a new 24-acre brownfield-turned-greenspace adjacent to the new Center. Slated to open in summer 2013, the land will be home to varied habitat for native species, as well as to biking and walking paths, and will become the new outdoor classroom for the Urban Ecology Center.

## **Evaluating Our Work**

We also saw a unique opportunity in the Menomonee Valley to measure the many impacts of our work, so we have partnered with the Medical College of Wisconsin to engage in an exciting community health initiative called "More Than A Pretty Place." This study seeks to understand how exposing children to nature and environmental education affects their health and wellness. With the participation of neighborhood schools, we will engage 5th and 6th-grade classrooms in a survey to measure the health impacts of NEEP during the 2012-13 school year. We hope that this pioneering study will help make measurable the connection between community health and access to green space and environmental education, and thus further efforts like ours all over the country.

# **Riverside Park**

At our Riverside Park branch, we planted, burned, moved soil, and focused on making Riverside Park more accessible.

### **Restoration by Fire**

With help from the Department of Natural Resources, Milwaukee County Parks, Dare Ecosystem Management and the Milwaukee Fire Department, a prescribed burn was conducted in Riverside Park. The burn took place over the prairie and the oak circle, and along the Milwaukee River flood plain. This successful technique knocked back the invasive species and allowed a more diverse suite of native species to emerge.

#### **Milwaukee Rotary Centennial Arboretum**

Work continued on the Milwaukee Rotary Centennial Arboretum project as staff and thousands of volunteers got their hands dirty. In fact, over 10,000 volunteer hours were logged! Reed Canary Grass was smothered along the Milwaukee River flood plain in an effort to eradicate the invasive species. In its place, over 8,500 native herbaceous plants and shrubs were planted along the flood plain. In preparation for planting in the spring, an old factory building adjacent to the donated arboretum land site was demolished, filled, and is being sculpted to create the foundation of the Milwaukee Rotary Centennial Arboretum. All of this work will ultimately result in the creation of an Arboretum that will expand our outdoor classroom, as well as increase biodiversity and the quality of wildlife habitat.

## **Expanding Accessibility**

As we continued to expand, restore, preserve, manage, and naturalize the Park, we wanted the changes to be enjoyed by everyone. The Park Access Plan, which has been unfolding over several years, is nearly complete! The plan was created by the Urban Ecology Center, Milwaukee County Parks, and other community stakeholders to increase accessibility and use of Riverside Park. As part of this plan, the old, elevated pedestrian bridge leading into Riverside Park over the Oak Leaf Trail was replaced by a new, accessible, bridge. Additionally, the uneven trails leading into Riverside Park were re-paved, providing access to the historic Olmsted trails. Once complete, this universally accessible set of trails near the Center will reach from North Ave to Locust Street and from the Centennial Arboretum through Riverside Park. These additions will help people with limited mobility and families with strollers more easily explore and enjoy the natural wonders of the river valley. And for those folks who choose to enjoy the river by floating down it, a new canoe launch was installed to improve access by canoe or kayak.

# **Washington Park**

At Washington Park we continued to expand our reach into the neighborhood, helping to provide a safe place for environmental education and exploration in Washington Park.

### **A Better Built Environment**

Several physical building improvements helped us better meet the needs of our community, programs, and visitors. Our partners at Milwaukee County Parks installed a new metal roof complete with a 5kW photovoltaic array and a solar thermal hot water system that will help offset our electric consumption and heat our water. Additionally, a new play trail and playground were installed. All of these additions will help us to engage people, bringing in more kids and families to Washington Park and introducing them to all the great things the Center has to offer.

### Lake Wisconsin

We also welcomed the addition of a 560 gallon fish tank (thanks to a cool, youth-driven grant program, Lead2Change) which has been affectionately dubbed "Lake Wisconsin." To accommodate the size of this tank we elected to build a new Wisconsin Native Animal Room for our fish, turtles, and other creatures to reside. We now have more room for our animals and their visitors, making it a comfortable space for all to learn and grow.

### **Driven to Discover**

The Young Scientists Club (YSC) at Washington Park engages youth ages 8-14 in science, research, and stewardship projects during afterschool and weekend hours. From water quality monitoring to gardening, the program promotes a sense of responsibility, both for self and place. This year the Young Scientists at Washington Park carried out an in-depth research project on habitat use by birds. They compared the distribution of birds on the large island in the Washington Park lagoon to a comparable area on the main land. The Young Scientists were selected to present their findings at the University of Minnesota's Driven to Discover research series—an incredible accomplishment for our ambitious youth.

Research shows two things which make a person environmentally aware: consistent contact with nature early in life and an adult mentor (parent, teacher, friend, Urban Ecology Center educator) who demonstrates positive behavior toward the environment. At the Urban Ecology Center, we provide the opportunity for this formative environmental experience with programs for children and adults of all ages.

#### **Inspiring Youth**

During the 2011-2012 fiscal year, our Neighborhood Environmental Education Program (NEEP) served 40 urban Milwaukee schools, enabling 20,888 students to experience urban wilderness, take part in experiential science education, and build ecological intelligence.

Schools partner with the Urban Ecology Center for an entire year, transforming the experience from just another field trip to a permanent outdoor classroom experience, where science concepts taught in the classroom are reinforced with hands-on outdoor activities during multiple visits.

Each teacher works with a team of Urban Ecology Center Environmental Educators to choose and customize a series of classes from the 70+ course catalogue that complements the work students are doing in the traditional classroom setting. Our custom designed programs meet the needs and desires of the teachers and school districts and get kids outside and engaged in science education. Find our partner schools listed online!

Through a two-year pilot and implementation study of the impact of NEEP on participating students' understanding of science concepts, the Center for Urban Initiatives and Research (CUIR) at the University of Wisconsin-Milwaukee found that students improved their scores on the subjects of simple machines, electricity and magnetism, astronomy, and orienteering after participating in NEEP. These results are consistent with other indicators that demonstrate that NEEP as a whole improves understanding of science concepts.

# **Education**

NEEP is complemented by our Young Scientists Clubs, summer camps, and weekend family activities designed to involve, inspire, educate, and connect kids to each other, to caring mentors, and to the natural world. This year, across the Center's 42 summer camps, 626 children were connected to urban nature. With our school-based program educators in the lead, summer camp is more than fun; kids are learning through hands-on, inquirybased activities every day of these week-long camps!

#### Taking it to the Next Level: Developing Environmental Leaders

The Urban Ecology Center offers two formative experiences for youth and young adults: the High School Outdoor Leader Program and the Adult Internship program. As a green career pipeline, these programs develop urban leaders with the commitment and the capability to move our community toward a more sustainable future.

This past year's High School Outdoor Leader Program kicked off with a new format. Now a two-year paid internship instead of a one-year experience, the program attracted 88 applicants to the available 18 spots. While students build a wide range of skills that include leadership development, rock climbing, kayaking, scientific research, and public speaking, they also serve as mentors to summer camp participants, building greater self-awareness and transferring valuable knowledge to a younger generation.

The Adult Internship Program serves both as a green career pipeline and an entry point to the environmental field. Interns gain experience in a wide variety of programs at our three branch locations and build their resumes with science experience. Our internship program is in high demand with 190 applicants for 21 openings.

Both of these programs offer a guided experience in community leadership and employment in the environmental and science fields.

### **Inspiring Adults**

Community programs keep the Urban Ecology Center and our adjacent parks abuzz with activity. The Center provides engaging opportunities for adults to attend lectures, workshops, and festivals, and learn new outdoor adventure skills like canoeing, kayaking, cross country skiing, and snowshoeing.

At our Riverside Park branch, the 10th Annual Local Farmer Open House attracted over 1000 people, connecting people to local producers and CSA farms. Our community is excited about sustainable food and over 600 people attended the Eat Local Resource Fair where we provided information and workshops on how to connect with local food resources and prepare for the two-week Eat Local Challenge. Washington Park hosted a successful winter lecture series for adults. Hundreds of people came throughout the year for lectures such as local historian John Gurda, filmmaker Chip Duncan, and inspiring environmentalist John Francis.

Both our Riverside Park and Washington Park branches have become festival destinations. We hosted vibrant celebrations at the Fall Festival, Autumn Celebration, and Earth Day festivals. We're proud to have provided quality programming to neighbors of all ages and interests, and we can't wait to see where the next year takes us!

# **Urban Adventures**

Urban Adventures programming at the Urban Ecology Center is designed to get groups outside, physically active, working together, and having fun!

### **Exploring Our Community**

Through our programs, individuals and groups discover nature in the city, challenge each other through new experiences, and build new skills as a foundation for lifelong healthy living. This year's Urban Adventure programming spanned all four seasons and included snowshoeing, canoeing, kayaking, hiking, rock climbing, and biking; all were interwoven with environmental education. While unusually warm spring temperatures and an early thaw impacted our maple syrup production, springtime urban adventurers explored our local parks and waterways by bike, foot, and boat.

The spirit of adventure continued into early summer as our Teen Adventure Challenge, an outdoor race through the urban wilds along the Milwaukee River, had record attendance with 17 teams representing 95 participants and 76 volunteers helping throughout the day.

### **Improving River Quality**

Thanks to a grant from the EPA Great Lakes Restoration Initiative, we offered several opportunities specifically designed to explore the Milwaukee, Menomonee, and Kinnickinnic River systems. These programs highlighted projects meant to improve water quality within these waterways and attract recreationalists back to our rivers.

Together with the Wisconsin Department of Natural Resources, the Alliance for the Great Lakes, and the Wisconsin Department of Natural Resources UW-Extension Water Action Volunteer Program, we launched an aesthetics-monitoring project on these three rivers to monitor the presence of garbage, accessibility issues, and wildlife sightings, all of which provide an essential baseline assessment of these areas. Aesthetics-monitoring helps us identify important information about the status of our waterways and the data that is collected provides a means for assessing public perception.







# **Citizen Science**

The Urban Ecology Center's Research and Citizen Science Program serves as a meaningful bridge between academic research and the community-atlarge, enabling collaboration and creating a more engaged, knowledgeable, and ecologically literate citizenry.

#### **Local Impacts**

Conservation practices in Milwaukee continue to be informed by the research and citizen science efforts at the Center. For example, this past fiscal year, longtime volunteer Robin Squier and High School Outdoor Leader Ethan Bott spearheaded an effort to put a resolution through Milwaukee's Common Council (which passed unanimously) to designate the City of Milwaukee as a Bird City, a designation that recognizes a city's bird conservation practices. This certification makes Milwaukee the largest community to receive recognition from Bird City Wisconsin.

### **Engaging Young Minds**

The combination of the High School Outdoor Leader program and Citizen Science and Research efforts provide the platform and resources for young student researchers to explore their interests in ecological issues and aspire towards careers in the environmental field. Ethan Bott and Humzah Abdulla, both of whom were involved with Citizen Science programs while High School Outdoor Leaders, worked to implement systems thinking into the environmental education curriculum at the Center, with a focus on improved learning skills for students.

Additionally, the Young Scientists Club at Washington Park carried out an in-depth research project on habitat use by birds and was selected to present their findings at the University of Minnesota's Driven to Discover research series. The Center was also chosen to participate on the Advisory Board of this initiative.

### **Spreading Our Wings**

The past year saw many exciting developments on a national level as the Research and Citizen Science team expands their reach. By attending the first annual conference on Public Participation in Scientific Research, serving on the Advisory Committee, and presenting research on the intersection of data management and stewardship, the Center continues to serve as a leader in citizen science research. The team also published a chapter in the book *Urban Bird Ecology and Conservation*, highlighting the Center's engagement of citizen science volunteers in migratory bird research.

# Land Stewardship

The Center's land stewardship team is currently managing over 50 acres of urban land. Careful and thoughtful stewardship has helped preserve and restore land along the Milwaukee River Corridor, in Washington Park, and now along the Menomonee River.

Volunteers played an active and vital role in our land stewardship efforts. Our dynamic group of volunteers has been engaged in every aspect of land stewardship – from the removal of invasive species, to the propagation of native plants on the landscape, to planting those plants into the ecosystem.

#### **Menomonee Valley**

The landscape around the Menomonee Valley branch is a new point of engagement for our land stewardship team. We broke ground on the 24acre park that will soon be our outdoor classroom. This cutting-edge, collaborative project combines the innovation of building soil, creating habitat for wildlife, and will provide hands-on opportunities to

explore the Menomonee River waterway. We are excited for this new park to become a Milwaukee destination for outdoor learning and recreation.

Additionally, the Center's Land Stewardship staff, Summer Interns, and High School Outdoor Leaders completed a 270 square foot green roof at the Menomonee Valley Center. This green roof is accessible to the public and will be used for programs, public education, and the demonstration of storm water management best-practices.

Prior to the opening of the Menomonee Valley branch, land stewardship volunteers have already logged over 100 hours of work on this burgeoning urban landscape!

#### **Washington Park**

Since the Urban Ecology Center opened our Washington Park branch in 2007, the land stewardship team has been working with volunteers to create an improved habitat by planting a variety of native Wisconsin species throughout the landscape.

In the 2011-2012 fiscal year, we began both wetland and woodland restoration at Washington Park. Beginning with the propagation of six hundred native Wisconsin plants, our goal is an additional 1,500 plantings for the spring of 2013. We planted understory trees, shrubs and wildflowers to create more layers, complexity, and plant diversity within this community and have hopes to replace some grass with forest and savannah species. This fiscal year, 70 trees and shrubs (including 50 native shrubs that will produce edible nuts and berries) and 50 wildflower species were planted in Washington Park! At the end of a very productive year, the land stewards engaged over 534 people and over 2,160 volunteer hours on healing the land in Washington Park.

#### **Riverside Park**

Over the past 15 years there has been a dramatic increase in diversity and habitat quality in Riverside Park and along the Milwaukee River Corridor. Hundreds of species of native Wisconsin plants have been planted in what was once an abandoned park with a degraded forest. With the tremendous effort by dedicated volunteers from churches, corporations, and organizations across Milwaukee, a total of almost 20,000 herbaceous plants and over 300 trees and shrubs were planted just this year!

Through a partnership with the City of Milwaukee Sanitation Department, the Land Stewardship team was able to compost over 300 truckloads of leaves, creating over 2,000 cubic meters of leaf compost to build and amend the topsoil for the Milwaukee Rotary Centennial Arboretum project. The first round of an extensive vegetation survey to catalog the diversity of species throughout the entire 40 acres of land within the Arboretum is nearly complete! This initiative will help us monitor our progress and document our impact within Riverside Park.

#### **Rotary Centennial Arboretum**

Overall, volunteers logged more than 3,700 hours of work on the Milwaukee Centennial Arboretum land. From removing invasive species to planting a more diverse mix of natives, we continued to prepare for the opening of the Arboretum that will increase awareness and appreciation of the biological diversity found in our area.

This year the Arboretum was the recipient of a generous donation of land from the estate of our dearly missed friend and partner Pieter Godfrey. We completed a competitive process with a number of local artists for the design of an iconic archway sculpture to mark the entrance of the Arboretum.

As the fiscal year closed, we were poised to begin construction on the formerly industrial land, having finalized plans and selected a contractor to do the earthwork. Big things will be happening in the next year, as the project is on schedule to open in September 2013.

Through projects like the opening of the Menomonee Valley branch and the Milwaukee Rotary Centennial Arboretum, we are able to build effective partnerships and catalyze meaningful change in our community.

# Financial Report

While reporting favorable current year results, the Center has also been strengthened for future success. The Center maintained a keen focus on strong cash and reserve levels, a positive ratio of assets to liabilities and a robust fundraising pipeline. In addition, we continued to focus on the staff and infrastructure needed for the continued sustainability of the Center. New contributions to our endowment this year continue to build toward a bright financial future.

We have provided two financial statements to give the most accurate picture of our organization. Our Audited Statements include capital projects such as the Milwaukee Rotary Centennial Arboretum and the Menomonee Valley branch building project, whereas our Operating Statement of Activities shows the day-to-day costs of performing our core mission. Our operating revenue was \$2.5 million, while our total organization revenue was \$7.8 million for the 2011-12 fiscal year.



# **Milwaukee Rotary Centennial Arboretum**

The Urban Ecology Center has been working to improve the assets and accessibility of Riverside Park for the community since our founders formed a grassroots group in the early 1990s. The Park Access Project was an outgrowth of our plans to serve more students from the Riverside Park branch. This past fiscal year, we nearly completed the Park Access Plan with the replacement of the pedestrian bridge and by re-paving the trails leading into Riverside Park.
