The excitement is contagious as Solomon, age 8, shares what he's learning in day camp at the Urban Ecology Center.

"We learn about animals, reptiles..." His younger brother, Omar, age 5, eagerly interrupts, "And snakes!" Solomon rolls his eyes, "Snakes <u>are</u> reptiles! And we learn about amphibians too!"

The joy of these boys isn't lost on their mother, Areej, who greets them at the end of each day. "Omar is happier, he wants to bring gifts for his teacher and he's so excited about his day at camp." She appreciates that the boys spend a lot of time outdoors where children are allowed to be themselves, actively observing, learning, and designing imaginative play with the guidance of a mentor.

"They have more knowledge now about plants and animals, so it's exciting when we go on our own hikes, that they are teaching me about things now. I feel happy when I hear that, because they are actually learning something while they are having fun and being away from home."

Lynn Anders, UEC Environmental Education Manager, says "A connection to nature in childhood not only shapes

values and identity, but kids who have the opportunity to explore and play outdoors with the guidance of a mentor—even in the city or their own backyard—develop trust, confidence, and security in who they are. They learn to care for human and animal communities. This is why access to nature is one of the greatest gifts a child can receive."

Areej agrees completely. "It's important for kids to be involved with our urban natural areas. It helps create a sense of community. Now the boys are learning the *why*, the deeper reasons we take care of nature."

As another summer of active learning approaches, Omar and Solomon look forward to stepping back into their living classroom where the snakes and amphibians dwell. We look forward to seeing how your support continues to build the next generation of environmental stewards!


SHARING TALENT MAKES AN IMPACT
