AGE CATEGORIES

There are three age groups: 0-12, 13-17 and 18+.

PRIZES

The top three submissions of each age group will receive prizes, including an annual membership to the Urban Ecology Center and to the Sierra Club. The top winner of each age category is asked to perform/display their work on stage when the winners are announced at the Earth Day celebration.

DISPLAY

All entries may be displayed at Urban Ecology Center's Washington Park branch during the Earth Day celebration on April 23.

JUDGING CRITERIA

Entrants will be judged by a panel of community members, UEC staff and Sierra Club volunteers based on interpretation of the prompt, originality and technical skill.

RULES

Only one submission per person, regardless of the format

<u>Written word</u> – all prose or poetry is accepted, up to 1000 words. This could be fiction, non-fiction, an essay, or anything that you can think of!

<u>Visual art</u> – all visual interpretations of your favorite local greenspace are accepted, including photographs, drawings, sculptures, and more! Attached to any submitted visual art should be a 100-200 word reflection on your submission, exploring why that place is your favorite green space.

<u>Film</u> – all types of film are accepted, such as a nature documentary, a fictional story or a newscast. They must be limited to three minutes. Please upload the video to YouTube or a similar video hosting platform and provide the link.

<u>Song/dance</u> – all types of song or dance are accepted. They must be limited to three minutes. Please submit audio files or video links.
